Definition and Scriptures

907 *baptizw* baptizo bap-tid'-zo

from a derivative of 911; TDNT-1:529,92; verb to dip, sink:—

NAS-Baptist (3), baptize (9), baptized (51), baptizes (1), baptizing (10), ceremonially washed (1), undergo (1).

AV-baptize (76), wash 2, baptist 1, baptized + 2258 1; 80

- 1) to dip repeatedly, to immerse, to submerge (of vessels sunk)
- 2) to cleanse by dipping or submerging, to wash, to make clean with water, to wash one's self, bathe

3) to overwhelm

Not to be confused with 911, bapto. The clearest example that shows the meaning of baptizo is a text from the Greek poet and physician Nicander, who lived about 200 B.C. It is a recipe for making pickles and is helpful because it uses both words. Nicander says that in order to make a pickle, the vegetable should first be 'dipped' (bapto) into boiling water and then 'baptised' (baptizo) in the vinegar solution. Both verbs concern the immersing of vegetables in a solution. But the first is temporary. The second, the act of baptising the vegetable, produces a permanent change. When used in the New Testament, this word more often refers to our union and identification with Christ than to our water baptism. e.g. Mk 16:16. 'He that believes and is baptised shall be saved'. Christ is saying that mere intellectual assent is not enough. There must be a union with him, a real change, like the vegetable to the pickle! (Bible Study Magazine, James Montgomery Boice, May 1989).

Matthew 3:6

1) immersion, submersion

- 1a) of calamities and afflictions with which one is quite overwhelmed
- 1b) of John's baptism, that purification rite by which men on confessing their sins were bound to spiritual reformation, obtained the pardon of their past sins and became qualified for the benefits of the Messiah's kingdom soon to be set up. This was valid Christian baptism, as this was the only baptism the apostles received and it is not recorded anywhere that they were ever rebaptised after Pentecost.
- 1c) of Christian baptism; a rite of immersion in water as commanded by Christ, by which one after confessing his sins and professing his faith in Christ, having been born again by the Holy Spirit unto a new life, identifies publicly with the fellowship of Christ and the church.

In Rom 6:3 Paul states we are "baptised unto death" meaning that we are not only dead to our former ways, but they are buried. To return to them is as unthinkable for a Christian as for one to dig up a dead corpse! In Moslem countries a new believer has little trouble with Moslems until he is publicly baptised. It is then, that the Moslems' know he means business, and then the persecution starts. See also discussion of baptism under No. 907.

Mark 7:4

And *when they come* from the market, except they **wash** <<u>907 baptizo></u>, they eat not. And many other things there be, which they have received to hold, *as* the **washing** <<u>909 baptismos></u> of cups, and pots, brasen vessels, and of tables. {pots: sextarius is about a pint and an half} {tables: or, beds}

Mark 7:8

For laying aside the commandment of God, ye hold the tradition of men, *as* the **washing** <<u>909 baptismos></u> of pots and cups: and many other such like things ye do.

Mark 8:28

And they answered, John the Baptist <<u>910 Baptistes></u>: but some *say*, Elias; and others, One of the prophets.

Mark 10:38

But Jesus said unto them, Ye know not what ye ask: can ye drink of the cup that I drink of? and be baptized <907 baptizo> with the baptism <908 baptisma> that I am baptized <907 baptizo> with?

Mark 10:39

And they said unto him, We can. And Jesus said unto them, Ye shall indeed drink of the cup that I drink of; and with the baptism <u><908 baptisma></u> that I am baptized withal <u><907 baptizo></u> shall ye be baptized <u><907 baptizo></u>:

Mark 11:30

The baptism <<u>908 baptisma></u> of John, was *it* from heaven, or of men? answer me.

Mark 16:16

He that believeth and is baptized <<u>907 baptizo></u> shall be saved; but he that believeth not shall be damned.

Luke 3:3

And he came into all the country about Jordan, preaching the baptism <<u>908 baptisma></u> of repentance for the remission of sins;

Luke 3:7

Then said he to the multitude that came forth to be baptized <u><907 baptizo></u> of him, O generation of vipers, who hath warned you to flee from the wrath to come?

Luke 3:12

Then came also publicans to be baptized <<u>907 baptizo></u>, and said unto him, Master, what shall we do?

Luke 3:16

John answered, saying unto *them* all, I indeed baptize <u><907 baptizo></u> you with water; but one mightier than I cometh, the latchet of whose shoes I am not worthy to unloose: he shall baptize <u><907 baptizo></u> you with the Holy Ghost and with fire:

Luke 3:21

¶ Now when all the people were baptized <u><907 baptizo></u>, it came to pass, that Jesus also being baptized <u><907 baptizo></u>, and praying, the heaven was opened,

Luke 7:20

When the men were come unto him, they said, John Baptist <<u><910 Baptistes></u> hath sent us unto thee, saying, Art thou he that should come? or look we for another?

Luke 7:28-30

- 28 For I say unto you, Among those that are born of women there is not a greater prophet than John the Baptist <u><910 Baptistes></u>: but he that is least in the kingdom of God is greater than he.
- 29 And all the people that heard *him*, and the publicans, justified God, being baptized <<u>907 baptizo</u>> with the baptism <u><908 baptisma></u> of John.
- 30 But the Pharisees and lawyers rejected the counsel of God against themselves, being <<u>907 baptizo></u> not baptized <u><<u>907 baptizo></u> of him. {rejected: or, frustrated} {against...: or, within themselves}</u>

Luke 7:33

For John the Baptist <<u>910 Baptistes></u> came neither eating bread nor drinking wine; and ye say, He hath a devil.

Luke 9:19

They answering said, John the Baptist <<u>910 Baptistes></u>; but some *say*, Elias; and others *say*, that one of the old prophets is risen again.

Luke 11:38

And when the Pharisee saw *it*, he marvelled that he had not first **washed** <<u>907 baptizo></u> before dinner.

Luke 12:50

But I have a baptism <<u>908 baptisma></u> to be baptized <<u>907 baptizo></u> with; and how am I straitened till it be accomplished! {straitened: or, pained}

Luke 16:24

And he cried and said, Father Abraham, have mercy on me, and send Lazarus, that he may dip <<u>911 bapto></u> the tip of his finger in water, and cool my tongue; for I am tormented in this flame.

Luke 20:4

The baptism < 908 baptisma> of John, was it from heaven, or of men?

John 1:25

And they asked him, and said unto him, Why baptizest thou <<u>907 baptizo></u> then, if thou be not that Christ, nor Elias, neither that prophet?

John 1:26

John answered them, saying, I baptize <<u>907 baptizo></u> with water: but there standeth one among you, whom ye know not;

John 1:28

These things were done in Bethabara beyond Jordan, where John was baptizing <<u>907</u> <u>baptizo></u>.

John 1:31

And I knew him not: but that he should be made manifest to Israel, therefore am I come baptizing <<u>907 baptizo></u> with water.

John 1:33

And I knew him not: but he that sent me to baptize <907 baptizo> with water, the same said unto me, Upon whom thou shalt see the Spirit descending, and remaining on him, the same is he which baptizeth <907 baptizo> with the Holy Ghost.

John 3:22

¶ After these things came Jesus and his disciples into the land of Judaea; and there he tarried with them, and baptized $\underline{<907 \text{ baptizo}}$.

John 3:23

And John also was baptizing <<u>907 baptizo></u> in Aenon near to Salim, because there was much water there: and they came, and were baptized <<u>907 baptizo></u>.

John 3:26

And they came unto John, and said unto him, Rabbi, he that was with thee beyond Jordan, to whom thou barest witness, behold, the same baptizeth <<u>907 baptizo></u>, and all *men* come to him.

John 4:1-2

- 1 ¶ When therefore the Lord knew how the Pharisees had heard that Jesus made and baptized <<u>907 baptizo></u> more disciples than John,
- 2 (Though Jesus himself baptized <<u>907 baptizo></u> not, but his disciples,)

John 10:40

And went away again beyond Jordan into the place where John at first baptized ≤ 907 <u>baptizo></u> and there he abode.

John 13:26

Jesus answered, He it is, to whom I shall give a sop, when I have dipped <u><911 bapto></u> *it*. And when he had dipped the sop, he gave *it* to Judas Iscariot, *the son* of Simon.

Acts 1:5

For John truly baptized <u><907 baptizo></u> with water; but ye shall be baptized <u><907</u> <u>baptizo></u> with the Holy Ghost not many days hence.

Acts 1:22

Beginning from the baptism ≤ 908 baptisma> of John, unto that same day that he was taken up from us, must one be ordained to be a witness with us of his resurrection.

Acts 2:38

Then Peter said unto them, Repent, and be baptized <<u>907 baptizo></u> every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins, and ye shall receive the gift of the Holy Ghost.

Acts 2:41

Then they that gladly received his word were baptized <u><907 baptizo></u>: and the same day there were added *unto them* about three thousand souls.

Acts 8:12

But when they believed Philip preaching the things concerning the kingdom of God, and the name of Jesus Christ, they were baptized <u><907 baptizo></u>, both men and women.

Acts 8:13

Then Simon himself believed also: and when he was baptized <u><907 baptizo></u>, he continued with Philip, and wondered, beholding the miracles and signs which were done. {miracles...: Gr. signs and great miracles}

Acts 8:16

(For as yet he was fallen upon none of them: only they were baptized <<u>907</u> <u>baptizo></u> in the name of the Lord Jesus.)

Acts 8:36

And as they went on *their* way, they came unto a certain water: and the eunuch said, See, *here is* water; what doth hinder me to be baptized <<u>907 baptizo></u>?

Acts 8:38

And he commanded the chariot to stand still: and they went down both into the water, both Philip and the eunuch; and he baptized <<u>907 baptize></u> him.

Acts 9:18

And immediately there fell from his eyes as it had been scales: and he received sight

forthwith, and arose, and was baptized <907 baptizo>.

Acts 10:37

That word, *I say*, ye know, which was published throughout all Judaea, and began from Galilee, after the baptism which John preached;

Acts 10:47

Can any man forbid water, that these should <<u>907 baptizo></u> not be baptized <<u>907</u> <u>baptizo></u>, which have received the Holy Ghost as well as we?

Acts 10:48

And he commanded them to be baptized $\leq 907 \text{ baptizo} >$ in the name of the Lord. Then prayed they him to tarry certain days.

Acts 11:16

Then remembered I the word of the Lord, how that he said, John indeed baptized <<u>907 baptizo></u> with water; but ye shall be baptized <u><<u>907 baptizo></u></u> with the Holy Ghost.

Acts 13:24

When John had first preached before his coming the baptism <<u>908 baptisma></u> of repentance to all the people of Israel.

Acts 16:15

And when she was baptized $\underline{<907 \text{ baptizo}>}$, and her household, she besought *us*, saying, If ye have judged me to be faithful to the Lord, come into my house, and abide *there*. And she constrained us.

Acts 16:33

And he took them the same hour of the night, and washed *their* stripes; and was baptized <<u>907 baptizo></u>, he and all his, straightway.

Acts 18:8

And Crispus, the chief ruler of the synagogue, believed on the Lord with all his house; and many of the Corinthians hearing believed, and were baptized <<u>907</u> <u>baptizo></u>.

Acts 18:25

This man was instructed in the way of the Lord; and being fervent in the spirit, he spake and taught diligently the things of the Lord, knowing only the baptism <<u>908</u><<u>908 baptisma>></u> of John.

Acts 19:3

And he said unto them, Unto what then were ye baptized <<u>907 baptizo></u>? And they said, Unto John's baptism <<u>908 <908 baptisma>></u>.

Acts 19:4

Then said Paul, John verily baptized <u><907 baptizo></u> with the baptism <u><908<908 baptisma></u> of repentance, saying unto the people, that they should believe on him which should come after him, that is, on Christ Jesus.

Acts 19:5

When they heard *this*, they were baptized <<u>907 baptizo></u> in the name of the Lord Jesus.

Acts 22:16

And now why tarriest thou? arise, and be baptized <<u>907 baptizo></u>, and wash away thy sins, calling on the name of the Lord.

Romans 6:3

Know ye not, that so many of us as were baptized <<u>907 baptizo></u> into Jesus Christ were baptized <<u>907 baptizo></u> into his death? {were: or, are}

Romans 6:4

Therefore we are buried with him by baptism <<u>908 baptisma></u> into death: that like as Christ was raised up from the dead by the glory of the Father, even so we also should walk in newness of life.

1 Corinthians 1:13 Is Christ divided? was Paul crucified for you? or were ye baptized <907 baptizo> in the name of Paul?

1 Corinthians 1:14 ¶ I thank God that I baptized <907 baptizo> none of you, but Crispus and Gaius;

1 Corinthians 1:15 Lest any should say that I had baptized ≤ 907 baptizo> in mine own name.

1 Corinthians 1:16

And I baptized <<u>907 baptizo></u> also the household of Stephanas: besides, I know not whether I baptized <<u>907 baptizo></u> any other.

1 Corinthians 1:17

¶ For Christ sent me not to baptize $\leq 907 \text{ baptizo} >$, but to preach the gospel: not with wisdom of words, lest the cross of Christ should be made of none effect. {words: or, speech}

1 Corinthians 10:2 And were all baptized <<u>907 baptizo></u> unto Moses in the cloud and in the sea;

1 Corinthians 12:13 For by one Spirit are we all baptized <907 baptizo> into one body, whether we be Jews

or Gentiles, whether we be bond or free; and have been all made to drink into one Spirit.

1 Corinthians 15:29

Else what shall they do which are baptized <<u>907 baptizo></u> for the dead, if the dead rise not at all? why are they then baptized <<u>907 baptizo></u> for the dead?

Galatians 3:27

For as many of you as have been baptized <907 baptizo> into Christ have put on Christ.

Ephesians 4:5 One Lord, one faith, one baptism <u><908 baptisma></u>,

Colossians 2:12

Buried with him in baptism ≤ 908 baptisma \geq , wherein also ye are risen with *him* through the faith of the operation of God, who hath raised him from the dead.

Hebrews 6:2

Of the doctrine of baptisms <<u>909 baptismos></u>, and of laying on of hands, and of resurrection of the dead, and of eternal judgment.

Hebrews 9:10

Which stood only in meats and drinks, and divers **washings** <u><909 baptismos></u>, and carnal ordinances, imposed *on them* until the time of reformation. {ordinances: or, rites, or, ceremonies}

1 Peter 3:21

¶ The like figure whereunto *even* baptism ≤ 908 baptisma \geq doth also now save us (not the putting away of the filth of the flesh, but the answer of a good conscience toward God,) by the resurrection of Jesus Christ:

Revelation 19:13 And he *was* clothed with a vesture dipped <u><911 bapto></u> in blood: and his name is called The Word of God.
