Leviticus 21:7

'They shall not take a woman who is profaned by harlotry, nor shall they take a woman <u>divorced</u> from her husband; for he is holy to his God.

Leviticus 21:14

'A widow, or a <u>divorced</u> woman, or one who is profaned by harlotry, these he may not take; but rather he is to marry a virgin of his own people,

Leviticus 22:13

'But if a priest's daughter becomes a widow or <u>divorced</u>, and has no child and returns to her father's house as in her youth, she shall eat of her father's food; but no layman shall eat of it.

Numbers 30:9

"But the vow of a widow or of a <u>divorced</u> woman, everything by which she has bound herself, shall stand against her.

Deuteronomy 22:19

and they shall fine him a hundred *shekels* of silver and give it to the girl's father, because he publicly defamed a virgin of Israel. And she shall remain his wife; he cannot divorce her all his days.

Deuteronomy 22:29

then the man who lay with her shall give to the girl's father fifty *shekels* of silver, and she shall become his wife because he has violated her; he cannot <u>divorce</u> her all his days.

Jeremiah 3:1

God says, "If a husband divorces his wife And she goes from him And belongs to another man, Will he still return to her? Will not that land be completely polluted? But you are a harlot with many lovers; Yet you turn to Me," declares the LORD.

Jeremiah 3:8

"And I saw that for all the adulteries of faithless Israel, I had sent her away and given her a writ of <u>divorce</u>, yet her treacherous sister Judah did not fear; but she went and was a harlot also.

Ezekiel 44:22

"And they shall not marry a widow or a <u>divorced</u> woman but shall take virgins from the offspring of the house of Israel, or a widow who is the widow of a priest.

Malachi 2:16

so that WHILE SEEING, THEY MAY SEE AND NOT PERCEIVE, AND WHILE HEARING, THEY MAY HEAR AND NOT UNDERSTAND, OTHERWISE THEY MIGHT RETURN AND BE **FORGIVEN** <863>."

Mark 4:36

Leaving <863> the crowd, they *took Him along with them in the boat, just as He was; and other boats were with Him.

Mark 5:19

And He did not **let** <863> him, but He *said to him, "Go home to your people and report to them what great things the Lord has done for you, and *how*He had mercy on you."

Mark 5:37

And He **allowed** <863> no one to accompany Him, except Peter and James and John the brother of James.

Mark 7:8

"Neglecting $\leq 863 \geq$ the commandment of God, you hold to the tradition of men."

Mark 7:12

you no longer **permit** <863> him to do anything for *hi*s father or *hi*s mother;

Mark 7:27

And He was saying to her, "Let $\leq 863 \geq$ the children be satisfied first, for it is not good to take the children's bread and throw it to the dogs."

Mark 8:13

Leaving <863> them, He again embarked and went away to the other side.
