Evangelists

An evangelist [euaggelistes (yoo-ang-ghel-is-tace')] is a diakonos (dee-ak'-on-os), a servant with the sole purpose to proclaim the gospel. The gospel message is the substance of the call of an evangelist as the Greek will point out. Refer to the study on Gospel and Church: Forms and Practices for a fuller study on this and other key points of Scripture.
