Introduction

The disciples (students, pupils) are the ekklesia (church) and they are to learn about God, Jesus and the ways of the Lord. Does the Scripture provide specific thing that all disciples should know? Let's do an exegete of Scripture key words and find out. Remember, this is not a comprehensive list of what a disciple should know or learn, but just some specific commands from Jesus, the Apostles and Scripture on what should be learned and known. Read all the Scripture verses listed in this study and go to your bibles and read the full passages to get the proper context and meaning of the verses. You will see that not every occurrence of the word is specific to our task of discovering what it is that a disciple should know and learn. We have created a list of the specific things we are told to learn in Scripture from the exegete of *manthano*. Do the same thing for yourselves from the study of the other words listed here so we can learn what we are to know and learn as a disciple of Jesus:

Mathano (man-than '-o)

- To desire compassion, not sacrifice.
- To learn from the example of Jesus.
- Take the yoke of Jesus upon ourselves.
- Learn the parable of the fig tree.
- Learn from Father God the Scriptures.
- Keep your eye on those who cause dissensions and hindrances contrary to the apostolic teaching.
- Not to exceed or add to what is written in Scripture for what the ekklesia is called to do.
- Orderliness in the church regarding the use of spiritual gifts.
- Women are to learn from their husbands and not to verbally engage when meeting as a church.
- The Holy Spirit comes by faith and not through the working of the Law.
- To destroy the way of the flesh as those who are without Christ walk.
- To learn from Paul and practice what he and the apostles do and teach.
- To be content in whatever circumstances you find yourselves in.
- Learn from those gifted in the church with the responsibility to teach.
- A woman must quietly **receive** instruction with entire submissiveness.
- A widow with children or grandchildren must first learn to practice piety in regard to their own family and to make some return to their parents.
- Widows must learn their duties in the Lord and godly behavior is speech and refrain from idleness of be refused any financial support from the church.
- Turn away from the church those who do not exercise godliness and learning.
- Continue in the things you have **learned** and become convinced of, knowing from whom you have
- To engage in good deeds to meet pressing needs, so you will not become unfruitful.
- Jesus learned obedience from the things which He suffered and we are to do likewise.

There are well over 200 verses where the word *ginosko* appears and because it is used in various contexts as the definition above discloses, we will not list every verse. However, we strongly encourage you to obtain a Strong's Concordance of the King James Bible or a concordance of the New American Standard Bible, preferably the 1995 edition for these are the two best word-for-word translations available today. When engaged in an exegetical study, the literal translation bibles are best for they remain truer to the original language translations. For those of you with a computer and internet connection, we highly recommend the Online Bible which is available for free. All our studies use the online bible software for we have used this software since their first release back in the early 1980's. You may need to pay a small \$15 royalty payment for the NASB bible, but that is a tiny investment for doing diligent bible study.
