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Teachers hold the office of **Diakonos** (*dee-ak'-on-os*) which means servant. This term has been translated as deacon six times in Scripture and is not to be seen as a singular office but as a category for multiple offices for which teachers occupy. Please see the study on <u>Church: Forms and Practices</u> for a fuller study on this and other key points of Scripture.

Matthew 4:23 Jesus was going throughout all Galilee, **teaching <1321 didasko>** in their synagogues and proclaiming the gospel of the kingdom, and healing every kind of disease and every kind of sickness among the people.

Matthew 5:2 He opened His mouth and *began* to **teach <1321 didasko>** them, saying, Matthew 5:19 "Whoever then annuls one of the least of these commandments, and **teaches <1321 didasko>** others *to do* the same, shall be called least in the kingdom of heaven; but whoever keeps and **teaches <1321 didasko>** *them*, he shall be called great in the kingdom of heaven.

Matthew 7:29 for He was **teaching <1321 didasko>** them as *one* having authority, and not as their scribes.

- Matthew 9:35 Jesus was going through all the cities and villages, **teaching <1321 didasko>** in their synagogues and proclaiming the gospel of the kingdom, and healing every kind of disease and every kind of sickness.
- Matthew 11:1 When Jesus had finished giving instructions to His twelve disciples, He departed from there to **teach <1321 didasko>** and preach in their cities.
- Matthew 13:54 He came to His hometown and *began* **teaching <1321 didasko>** them in their synagogue, so that they were astonished, and said, "Where *did* this man *get* this wisdom and *these* miraculous powers?
- Matthew 15:9 'BUT IN VAIN DO THEY WORSHIP ME, **TEACHING <1321 didasko>** AS **DOCTRINES <1319 didaskalia>** THE PRECEPTS OF MEN."
- Matthew 21:23 When He entered the temple, the chief priests and the elders of the people came to Him while He was **teaching <1321 didasko>**, and said, "By what authority are You doing these things, and who gave You this authority?"
- Matthew 22:16 And they \*sent their disciples to Him, along with the Herodians, saying, "Teacher, we know that You are truthful and **teach <1321 didasko>** the way of God in truth, and defer to no one; for You are not partial to any.
- Matthew 26:55 At that time Jesus said to the crowds, "Have you come out with swords and clubs to arrest Me as *you would* against a robber? Every day I used to sit in the temple **teaching <1321 didasko>** and you did not seize Me.
- Matthew 28:15 And they took the money and did as they had been instructed <1321 didasko>; and this story was widely spread among the Jews, and is to this day.
- Matthew 28:20 **teaching <1321 didasko>** them to observe all that I commanded you; and lo, I am with you always, even to the end of the age."
- Mark 1:21 They \*went into Capernaum; and immediately on the Sabbath He entered the synagogue and *began* to **teach <1321 didasko>**.
- Mark 1:22 They were amazed at His teaching; for He was **teaching <1321 didasko>** them as *one* having authority, and not as the scribes.
- Mark 2:13 And He went out again by the seashore; and all the people were coming to Him, and He was **teaching <1321 didasko>** them.
- Mark 4:1 He began to **teach <1321 didasko>** again by the sea. And such a very large crowd gathered to Him that He got into a boat in the sea and sat down; and the whole crowd was by the sea on the land.
- Mark 4:2 And He was **teaching <1321 didasko>** them many things in parables, and was saying to them in His teaching,
- Mark 6:2 When the Sabbath came, He began to **teach <1321 didasko>** in the synagogue; and the many listeners were astonished, saying, "Where did this man *get* these things, and what is *this* wisdom given to Him, and such miracles as these performed by His hands?

- Mark 7:7 'BUT IN VAIN DO THEY WORSHIP ME, **TEACHING <1321 didasko>** AS DOCTRINES THE PRECEPTS OF MEN.'
- Mark 8:31 And He began to **teach <1321 didasko>** them that the Son of Man must suffer many things and be rejected by the elders and the chief priests and the scribes, and be killed, and after three days rise again.

- Mark 12:35 And Jesus *began* to say, as He **taught <1321 didasko>** in the temple, "How *is it that* the scribes say that the Christ is the son of David?
- Mark 14:49 "Every day I was with you in the temple teaching <1321 didasko>, and you did not seize Me; but *this has taken place* to fulfill the Scriptures."
- Luke 4:15 And He *began* **teaching <1321 didasko>** in their synagogues and was praised by all.
- Luke 4:31 And He came down to Capernaum, a city of Galilee, and He was **teaching** <1321 didasko> them on the Sabbath;
- Luke 5:3 And He got into one of the boats, which was Simon's, and asked him to put out a little way from the land. And He sat down and *began* **teaching <1321 didasko>** the people from the boat.
- Luke 5:17 One day He was **teaching <1321 didasko>**; and there were *some*Pharisees and teachers of the law sitting *there*, who had come from every village of
  Galilee and Judea and *from* Jerusalem; and the power of the Lord was *present* for
  Him to perform healing.
- Luke 6:6 On another Sabbath He entered the synagogue and was **teaching <1321 didasko>**; and there was a man there whose right hand was withered.
- Luke 11:1 It happened that while Jesus was praying in a certain place, after He had finished, one of His disciples said to Him, "Lord, **teach <1321 didasko>** us to pray just as John also **taught <1321 didasko>** his disciples."
- Luke 12:12 for the Holy Spirit will **teach <1321 didasko>** you in that very hour what you ought to say."
- Luke 13:10 And He was **teaching <1321 didasko>** in one of the synagogues on the Sabbath.
- Luke 13:22 And He was passing through from one city and village to another, **teaching** <1321 didasko>, and proceeding on His way to Jerusalem.
- Luke 13:26 "Then you will begin to say, 'We ate and drank in Your presence, and You taught <1321 didasko> in our streets';

- Luke 19:47 And He was **teaching <1321 didasko>** daily in the temple; but the chief priests and the scribes and the leading men among the people were trying to destroy Him,
- Luke 20:1 On one of the days while He was **teaching <1321 didasko>** the people in the temple and preaching the gospel, the chief priests and the scribes with the elders confronted *Him*,
- Luke 20:21 They questioned Him, saying, "Teacher, we know that You speak and **teach <1321 didasko>** correctly, and You are not partial to any, but teach **<1321 didasko>** the way of God in truth.
- Luke 21:37 Now during the day He was **teaching <1321 didasko>** in the temple, but at evening He would go out and spend the night on the mount that is called Olivet.
- Luke 23:5 But they kept on insisting, saying, "He stirs up the people, **teaching <1321 didasko>** all over Judea, starting from Galilee even as far as this place."
- John 6:59 These things He said in the synagogue as He **taught <1321 didasko>** in Capernaum.
- John 7:14 But when it was now the midst of the feast Jesus went up into the temple, and *began to* **teach** <1321 didasko>.
- John 7:28 Then Jesus cried out in the temple, **teaching <1321 didasko>** and saying, "You both know Me and know where I am from; and I have not come of Myself, but He who sent Me is true, whom you do not know.
- John 7:35 The Jews then said to one another, "Where does this man intend to go that we will not find Him? He is not intending to go to the Dispersion among the Greeks, and **teach <1321 didasko>** the Greeks, is He?
- John 8:2 Early in the morning He came again into the temple, and all the people were coming to Him; and He sat down and *began* to **teach <1321 didasko>** them.
- John 8:20 These words He spoke in the treasury, as He **taught <1321 didasko>** in the temple; and no one seized Him, because His hour had not yet come.
- John 8:28 So Jesus said, "When you lift up the Son of Man, then you will know that I am *He*, and I do nothing on My own initiative, but I speak these things as the Father **taught <1321 didasko>** Me.
- John 9:34 They answered him, "You were born entirely in sins, and are you **teaching** <1321 didasko> us?" So they put him out.
- John 14:26 "But the Helper, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in My name, He will **teach <1321 didasko>** you all things, and bring to your remembrance all that I said to you.
- John 18:20 Jesus answered him, "I have spoken openly to the world; I always **taught** <1321 didasko> in synagogues and in the temple, where all the Jews come together; and I spoke nothing in secret.
- Acts 1:1 The first account I composed, Theophilus, about all that Jesus began to do and **teach <1321 didasko>**.
- Acts 4:2 being greatly disturbed because they were **teaching <1321 didasko>** the people and proclaiming in Jesus the resurrection from the dead.
- Acts 4:18 And when they had summoned them, they commanded them not to speak or **teach <1321 didasko>** at all in the name of Jesus.
- Acts 5:21 Upon hearing *this*, they entered into the temple about daybreak and *began* to **teach <1321 didasko>**. Now when the high priest and his associates came, they

- called the Council together, even all the Senate of the sons of Israel, and sent *orders* to the prison house for them to be brought.
- Acts 5:25 But someone came and reported to them, "The men whom you put in prison are standing in the temple and **teaching <1321 didasko>** the people!"
- Acts 5:28 saying, "We gave you strict orders not to continue **teaching <1321 didasko>** in this name, and yet, you have filled Jerusalem with your teaching and intend to bring this man's blood upon us."
- Acts 5:42 And every day, in the temple and from house to house, they kept right on **teaching <1321 didasko>** and preaching Jesus *as* the Christ.
- Acts 11:26 and when he had found him, he brought him to Antioch. And for an entire year they met with the church and **taught <1321 didasko>** considerable numbers; and the disciples were first called Christians in Antioch.
- Acts 15:1 Some men came down from Judea and *began* **teaching <1321 didasko>** the brethren, "Unless you are circumcised according to the custom of Moses, you cannot be saved."
- Acts 15:35 But Paul and Barnabas stayed in Antioch, **teaching <1321 didasko>** and preaching with many others also, the word of the Lord.
- Acts 18:11 And he settled *there* a year and six months, **teaching <1321 didasko>** the word of God among them.
- Acts 18:25 This man had been instructed in the way of the Lord; and being fervent in spirit, he was speaking and **teaching <1321 didasko>** accurately the things concerning Jesus, being acquainted only with the baptism of John;
- Acts 20:20 how I did not shrink from declaring to you anything that was profitable, and **teaching <1321 didasko>** you publicly and from house to house,
- Acts 21:21 and they have been told about you, that you are **teaching <1321 didasko>** all the Jews who are among the Gentiles to forsake Moses, telling them not to circumcise their children nor to walk according to the customs.

- Acts 28:31 preaching the kingdom of God and **teaching <1321 didasko>** concerning the Lord Jesus Christ with all openness, unhindered.
- Romans 2:21 you, therefore, who **teach <1321 didasko>** another, do you not **teach <1321 didasko>** yourself? You who preach that one shall not steal, do you steal?
- Romans 12:7 if service, in his serving; or he who **teaches <1321 didasko>**, in his teaching;
- 1 Corinthians 4:17 For this reason I have sent to you Timothy, who is my beloved and faithful child in the Lord, and he will remind you of my ways which are in Christ, just as I **teach** <1321 didasko> everywhere in every church.
- 1 Corinthians 11:14 Does not even nature itself **teach <1321 didasko>** you that if a man has long hair, it is a dishonor to him,
- Galatians 1:12 For I neither received it from man, nor was I **taught <1321 didasko>** it, but *I received it* through a revelation of Jesus Christ.
- Ephesians 4:21 if indeed you have heard Him and have been **taught <1321 didasko>** in Him, just as truth is in Jesus,

- Colossians 1:28 We proclaim Him, admonishing every man and **teaching <1321 didasko>** every man with all wisdom, so that we may present every man complete in Christ.
- Colossians 2:7 having been firmly rooted and now being built up in Him and established in your faith, just as you were **instructed <1321 didasko>**, and overflowing with gratitude.
- Colossians 3:16 Let the word of Christ richly dwell within you, with all wisdom **teaching** <1321 didasko> and admonishing one another with psalms *and* hymns *and* spiritual songs, singing with thankfulness in your hearts to God.
