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Introduction

There is much discussion and controversy concerning the gifts of the Holy Spirit. In most occurrences however, when gifts of the Holy Spirit are mentioned the reality is it is generally the miraculous gifts of the Spirit that garner the attention of the Pentecostal and charismatic groups: Healing and Tongues. This study shall address *glossolalia* - the speaking in tongues. Pentecostal and charismatic groups are the main proponents of glossolalia while other conservative Christian groups contend the cessation of all miraculous gifts of the Holy Spirit. Whenever strong contentions occur - and this is certainly an area where it does - we must look to the final court of arbitration to settle the issue - Holy Scripture.

Opponents of the miraculous gifts tend to use First Corinthians as the basis of their cessation.

1 Corinthians 13:8

Love never fails; but if *there are gifts of* prophecy, they will be done away; if *there are* tongues, they will cease; if *there is* knowledge, it will be done away.

I find it very difficult at best to see this Scripture as evidence of current cessation for knowledge is still with us. Rather this is saying there will come a time when this shall cease but there is no reason to believe they *have already* ceased. I listened and examined their parsing of the Greek text and do not conclude its soundness.

Proponents of glossolalia rely heavily upon the narrative passages in the book of Acts. Their argument usually begins with claims that there was a special filling or baptism of the Holy Spirit after conversion or regeneration and this subsequent baptism of the Spirit always manifest itself with the speaking in an unknown tongue.

Who's correct? If the truth be known, and it shall, both are incorrect. There is no justification for cessation from Scripture, though there is a strong case to be made in practicality. I have not heard or read about a genuine case of biblical tongues outside of those recorded in Scripture, nor have I witness or heard of any genuine gift of tongues from the Pentecostal and Charismatic groups. They are in fact guilty of *pseudoglossa* ... a false and counterfeit manifestation of the gift of tongues.

Let's begin with a discussion of the term *unknown* tongue. The Pentecostal-Charismatic groups hereafter referred to as "PC" interpret unknown in the phrase "unknown tongue" as an unknown *language*, a *new* language previously unknown to humanity. They claim that in Corinth, tongues were utterances of apparently unrelated syllables and do not display the characteristics of any known human language. That is a categorically false interpretation of Scripture and must be rejected on biblical grounds. There is simply no biblical or spiritual basis for such an erroneous position for a "new" language based in gibberish. The phrase "unknown tongue" as used in Scripture means a language not previously known by the person speaking the language … a language new to the user,

not a new human or spiritual language. Biblical *tongues* (plural) are known human languages not previously known by the person speaking the miraculously acquired human dialect.

For example, a German who speaks and writes fluent German and English may through the miraculous power of the Holy Spirit begin speaking fluently in *Farsi*, a Middle-Eastern Aramaic language or some other human language, ancient or current. To continue with this example, the German gifted with this language may not even know that it is Farsi unless told by another who speaks that language. This seems to be the clear biblical meaning of tongues as we shall see upon examination of Scripture.

EXPOSITORY: ACTS 2:1-12 (Pentecost)

When we examine the Scriptures in Acts 2, we will discover there were several miracles that occurred on the fulfillment of the Feast of Pentecost. The feast of Pentecost is described in the Old Covent Torah (Leviticus 23:15-21).

The Miracles on That Day of Pentecost

- 1. The Noise or Voice from Heaven: Like a violent rushing wind that filled the entire house:
- 2. **Theophony:** Manifestation of God that appeared like a tongue of fire distributed upon each of the Apostles;
- 3. Filling of the Holy Spirit: New Covenant Promise of God "in" us;
- 4. Speaking in Tongues: Speaking in a previously unknown human language;
- 5. **Selection of Tongues:** God selects specific dialects based upon the native languages of each person present with the Apostles.

1st Miracle: The first miracle was the dramatic and violent entry of God's Holy Spirit. In verse two there was a *noise* from heaven that was like a mighty wind.

Acts 2:2

And suddenly there came from **heaven** a **noise** like a violent rushing wind, and it filled the whole house where they were sitting.

The **noise** from heaven **was** *like* a violent rushing wind that filled the house, but it was not a wind, but only sounded like a loud, rushing wind. It was God's purpose and intent to have this event noticed and known by the people gathered in Jerusalem for the Feast of Pentecost. In verse 6, this noise from heaven is called a φωνή phone (fo-nay') the Greek word mostly translated as **voice** in Scripture.

2nd Miracle: The second miracle was the Theophony (appearance of God), in this case God the Holy Spirit manifesting like a tongue of fire distributed upon the 12 Apostles. Matthias replaced Judas as the twelfth Apostle (Acts 1:23-26).

Acts 2:3

And there appeared to them tongues as of fire distributing themselves, and they rested on each one of them.

3rd Miracle: The third miracle was the 12 Apostles being filled with the Holy Spirit. **4th Miracle:** The fourth miracle was the Apostles speaking in the dialects or tongues of the other Jews present in the room in their native language.

Acts 2:4

And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak with other tongues, as the Spirit was giving them utterance.

We can also see that there was orderliness in their speaking with the phrase "as the Spirit was giving them utterance." This was not a simultaneous receipt of the gift of tongues, but a systematic dispersal of the gift as the Spirit gave them utterance. Scripture does not support that tongues is a singular language from heaven; that tongues is a heavenly language gifted to those receiving the Spirit; nor that all began speaking simultaneously in a haphazard and chaotic manner.

1 Corinthians 14:33 for God is not [a God] of confusion but of peace, as in all the churches of the saints.

5th **Miracle:** The fifth miracle is the tongues selected by God for the Apostles to speak. Tongues are human dialects or spoken languages ... and the tongues selected by God on this Day of Pentecost were the tongues or languages of the other Jewish colonies throughout the Roman Empire that were present in the room with the Apostles. These tongues (dialects) were languages never spoken by the Galilean Jews, the 12 Apostles who previously never knew or spoke these other dialects.

Acts 2:8-12

- 8. "And how is it that we each hear them in our **own language to which we were born**?
- 9. "Parthians and Medes and Elamites, and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia,
- 10. Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the districts of Libya around Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, both Jews and proselytes,
- 11. Cretans and Arabs we hear them in our own tongues speaking of the mighty deeds of God."
- 12. And they all continued in amazement and great perplexity, saying to one another, "What does this mean?"

Verse 5 through 13 of Acts 2 establishes that devout Jews from all nations in the Roman Empire were present and each of the Apostles preached in the native language of their birth. God specifically chose to give the Apostles the native languages of those present on that day of Pentecost.

Acts 2:5-6

- 5 Now there were Jews living in Jerusalem, devout men from every nation under heaven.
- 6 And when this **sound** <phone (fo-nay)> occurred, the crowd came together, and were bewildered because each one of them was hearing **them** speak in his own language.

"Each one heard the Apostles speak in their own native language."

Acts 2:8

"And how is it that we each hear [them] in our own language to which we were born?

I must confess that when I first studied this section, I thought the Scripture meant that as each individual Apostle spoke, all present were simultaneously hearing the message in their native tongue. This turns out not to be the proper understanding of the miracles of Pentecost as verses 9-11 indicate.

Each Apostle was gifted with a specific tongue that was the birth language of those present. Each Apostle spoke in a native language of those present in the room. The gift was that of tongues and speaking; not that of an ears and hearing.

Based upon the passages of Acts 2, we find no evidence to support the existence of a *new language* previously unknown to humans to represent the miraculous gift of tongues. Those exercising such a false and demonic practice should immediately repent and seek God's forgiveness for embracing the doctrines and practices of demons.

The gift of tongues is God miraculously granting a *common language* previously unknown to the speaker as a means to proclaim the gospel to those of that native language and as the language the person should use in prayer to God. The miracles of Pentecost support the biblical understanding that this is the divine utterance of a human language not previously known by the speaker and is clearly a known human language. The upcoming expository on 1 Corinthians chapters 12 through 14 further supports such a position for tongues as well.

EXPOSITORY: 1 CORINTHIANS 12 - 14

Chapter 12: Purpose for Spiritual Gifts

Apparently, the early church was having some difficulty in understanding God's purpose for spiritual gifts and the proper conduct and use of their gifts. Just as some of the Apostles who walked with Jesus were bickering over who will be the greatest, the early church seems to have had a similar problem with who has the most or the greater gifts, and who appears not to have received any gifts at all.

First Corinthians 12 is teaching on the varieties of spiritual gifts God gives to His born again spiritual members of the body of Christ – His New Covenant Church. God grants different spiritual gifts to different people to accomplish the same purpose of God. The emphasis God is making through the Apostle Paul is the Unity of the One Spirit in One body ... One group of called out ones.

- 1 Corinthians 12:5-7
- 5 And there are varieties of ministries, and the same Lord.
- 6 There are varieties of effects, but the same God who works all things in all persons.
- 7 But to each one is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good.

There are many and various ministries of our One Lord; Diverse Workings of the same God: διαίρεσις diairesis (dee-ah'-ee-res-is). The church does not work to serve God, but it is God working through His church to serve His purpose. Verse 7 is saying God provides manifestations of the Spirit to each and every person He sanctifies for the συμφέρω sumphero (soom-fer'-o), the Greek verb that means profit or benefit from the collective pooling of people, talents and gifts. Paul goes on to name some spiritual gifts God provides to achieve His purpose in edifying His New Covenant church.

1 Corinthians 12:10 and to another the effecting of miracles, and to another prophecy, and to another the distinguishing of spirits, to another [various] kinds of tongues <glossa>, and to another the interpretation of tongues.

The Greek noun translated as miracles is δύναμις dunamis (doo'-nam-is) which means power or powerful works. While it can mean miracles, in 95% of the 120 or so occurrences of dunamis it is translated as powerful or mighty works.

Tongues: $\gamma\lambda\tilde{\omega}\sigma\sigma\alpha$ glossa (gloce-sah') is used to mean the literal organ in the body used for speech and the language or dialect used by a particular people distinct from that of other nations. Tongues in verse 10 is referring to the distinct human languages or dialects of people and something God will gift His people with to perform His purpose; and the Interpretation of tongues $\dot{\epsilon}\rho\mu\eta\nu\epsilon(\alpha)$ hermeneia (her-may-ni'-ah) is the Greek noun that means to translate or explain. Once again when one uses a newly acquired language in a manner other than its intended purpose (evangelism and prayer) as we will see in other verses that is precisely what was happening, a translator must be present to interpret what is being said, otherwise is is an abuse of God's gift. if not directed It presumably is a variation of the Greek god Hermes, the spokesman or herald of the gods.

In context, everything is pointing to the gift of tongues as a human language not previously known or studied but miraculously gifted to select individuals by God to achieve His purpose and work. An interpreter is a translator that will transpose spoken

words and/or texts from one language into another, a little like I am doing in this study when I define some Greek terms and their proper use.

Another key verse to put in proper perspective and the proper understanding of the manifestations of the Holy Spirit in each and every believer's life is brought to light in the next verse of Scripture.

1 Corinthians 12:11

But one and the same Spirit works all these things, distributing to each one individually just as He wills.

God is doing the work and distributing gifts to each and every born again believer He places in His body. The entire focus of 1 Corinthians 12 is on the diversity and differences among the ministries and people within the church all working together with their God given gifts to achieve the common good of all. God gifts to each person of the body specific tasks and purposes as He deems necessary.

The New Covenant church is the ekklhsia ekklesia (ek-klay-see'-ah) of God, His *called out ones*, His *assembly* of believers. The church is the body of Christ and not to be understood as a place you go to but who and what you are in the eyes of God.

1 Corinthians 12:27

¶ Now you are Christ's body, and individually members of it.

God gifts His body not based upon prior background, position, wealth, talent, skills, or education but upon the predetermined current and future spiritual needs and purposes. The works, workers and their specific tasks, role and duties within the body of Christ is preordained by God.

Chapter 13: Love Is The Greatest Spiritual Gift

This chapter is often referred to as the love chapter, and appropriately so. It is not coincidental that this chapter finds its place smack dab in the middle of Paul's discussion, rebuke and correction on spiritual gifts and their godly use and purpose. Paul, nay God is putting in order spiritual priorities and in the number 1 position is God's spiritual gift of love.

1 Corinthians 13:8

¶ Love never fails; but if [there are gifts of] prophecy, they will be done away; if [there are] tongues, they will cease; if [there is] knowledge, it will be done away.

Rather than this verse used as a proof text for the cessation of tongues, which it is not, God is saying of all things we have on this planet, love is what we take with us into eternity and that love is eternal ... will never cease. Prophesy will be done away with when it becomes fulfilled; carnal knowledge is temporal for it only applies to this three dimensional universe and that will cease to be when flesh and blood no longer exist;

and yes, the beloved gift of tongues the PC's falsely use to define themselves and their movement will indeed cease. Paul uses love as a segue into his discussion on the proper administration of spiritual gifts.

Chapter 14: The Tongues Fiasco

1 Corinthians 14:1

¶ Pursue love, yet desire earnestly spiritual [gifts,] but especially that you may prophesy.

Love is the greatest of all spiritual gifts and spiritual reality. Prophesy comes up very high for with this gift comes teaching and revealing the spiritual truth and realities of the Word of God. With the stage set, Paul talks about many gifts but I will only reveal the context on the proper use of tongues, even though there is not a person alive today this will benefit, for every instance of tongues being perpetuated today is pseudoglossa, a false and often demonic manifestation, what Scripture calls the doctrine of demons. More on this when we cover pseudoglossa later in the study.

Tongues are the languages used to speak to God. This seems to imply tongues is the language of prayer and should be used most frequently in this context. We should be in prayer more frequently than we find ourselves teaching others in a tongue gifted to us by God.

1 Corinthians 14:2

For one who speaks in a tongue **does not speak to men** but to God; for no one understands, but in [his] spirit he speaks mysteries.

Abuse number 2, speaking to each other in tongues. Abuse number one is the manufactured gibber pseudoglossa, false language. The word translated understand in the above verse is the Greek ἀκούω akouo (ak-oo'-o) which means hear or listen or as some translations use the work hearken or give audience. Of the 437 times akouo appears in Scripture, only eight times is it translated as anything other than hearing or listening, the above verse being a case in point. Hears or listens is the better translation, not understands.

1 Corinthians 14:4

One who speaks in a tongue edifies himself; but one who prophesies edifies the church.

Prayer is private communication with God and is self-edifying. This is not wrong to do for we all must pray to remain in close relationship with God. What God is saying is this gift of tongues is private by nature and not to be engaged in the manner we see today with pseudoglossa.

1 Corinthians 14:5

Now I wish that you all spoke in tongues, **but [even] more that you would prophesy**; and greater is one who prophesies than one who speaks in tongues, unless he interprets, so that the church may receive edifying.

God is not condemning the use of tongues, just putting tongues in its proper place, as a lesser spiritual gift. Prophesy and teaching is the most desirable of the spiritual gifts for it draws the hearers into a deeper relationship with God through deeper understanding of His Word and His revealed truths. That is why Paul states that translators (Interpreters) are better than those who speak in tongues for more will benefit.

1 Corinthians 14:6

¶ But now, brethren, if I come to you speaking in tongues, what will I profit you unless I speak to you either by way of revelation or of knowledge or of prophecy or of teaching?

God is declaring through Paul that tongues could only be of benefit to the church if it is used to reveal truths of God that will help us to know God more deeply through the discussion of God's Word (prophesy) and the teaching of it. The key point is the most important gifts are the ones used to benefit others, not self. Paul continues with this theme of rebuking the public use of tongues where nobody understands what is being said. This practice by the early believers is to cease. Notice it is the public use of tongues that cease, not tongues itself.

1 Corinthians 14:9

So also you, unless you utter by the tongue speech that is clear, how will it be known what is spoken? For you will be speaking into the air.

God is showing the uselessness of tongues in the public arena for you might as well speak to yourself quietly or into the thin air for all the good your words are doing.

- 1 Corinthians 14:10-11
- 10 There are, perhaps, a great many kinds of languages in the world, and no kind is without meaning.
- 11 If then I do not know the meaning of the language, I will be to the one who speaks a barbarian, and the one who speaks will be a barbarian to me.

Paul is contrasting and comparing tongues with purposeful and meaningful languages that are clearly understood by all parties. It seems tongues have a certain spontaneity associated with it that the speaker may not be aware of what the Spirit is motivating him to speak in his gift of tongues so interpretation by the person speaking is impossible and useless. The Greek noun φωνή phone (fo-nay') is translated as language in verses 10 and 11. Remember, it is the same word translated as noise in Acts 2:2. Paul did not shift gears or move away from the subject of tongues for the *voice* or sound made in speaking tongues either the party speaking or a party hearing must be able to know the clear meaning of what is being said, otherwise it is barbaric according to Paul. All language has meaning and unless someone knows what is being said ... shut up!

That's the gist of what God is saying. "Talk to me with your unknown language but be quiet in public" says the LORD.

- 1 Corinthians 14:13-16
- 13 Therefore let one who speaks in a tongue pray that he may interpret.
- 14 For if I pray in a tongue, my spirit prays, but my mind is unfruitful.
- 15 ¶ What is the outcome then? I will pray with the spirit and I will pray with the mind also; I will sing with the spirit and I will sing with the mind also.
- 16 Otherwise if you bless in the spirit only, how will the one who fills the place of the ungifted say the "Amen" at your giving of thanks, since he does not know what you are saying?

A tongue devoid of understanding is nothing more than useless babble. The mind is unfruitful because it does not know what is being said and there is not fruit to those who hear either. If the speaker and hearer both do not understand and know what is being said, then what is being said is useless and mindless babble. All these verses are saying tongues are to stop being spoken in public without interpretation and clarity of what is being stated. Once again the Lord is saying ... SHUT UP!

- 1 Corinthians 14:18-19
- 18 I thank God, I speak in tongues more than you all;
- 19 however, in the church I desire to speak five words with my mind so that I may instruct others also, rather than ten thousand words in a tongue.

Paul is saying one of two things here, and probably both. First he speaks in tongues more *frequently* than those of the Corinthian church and second Paul has been gifted with *numerous* tongues, more than all the Corinthian church, which he is thankful for. Going verse by verse through chapter 14 is indicative of just how serious the tongues problem has gotten in the Corinthian church. None of this discourse in in any positive concerning the use of tongues in public or at worship services. Paul's gift of tongues is to preach and teach to the Gentile nations that speak in different languages, and in his private devotions to God.

Tongues are a sign to unbelievers. I find it amazing that what we see is just the opposite. Tongues being a form of public worship services within the PC movement and conservative Christian groups and others using prophesy as a means to attract non-believers into their fellowship. Tsk, tsk, tsk. Are there no longer any church leaders able to read the bible with understanding or have ALL gone the way of apostasy?

- 1 Corinthians 14:22-23
- 22 So then tongues are for a sign, not to those who believe but to unbelievers; but prophecy is for a sign, not to unbelievers but to those who believe.
- 23 Therefore if the whole church assembles together and all speak in tongues, and ungifted men or unbelievers enter, will they not say that you are mad?

Tongues have limited and restricted use at worship services. A Translator or interpreter *must* be present and those who wish to use tongues in corporate prayer must do so in a group of two but not more than three and speak only one at a time. If all these conditions cannot be met, then the one who wishes to speak in tongues must remain silent and engage in quiet and private prayer.

- 1 Corinthians 14:26-28
- 26 ¶ What is the outcome then, brethren? When you assemble, each one has a psalm, has a teaching, has a revelation, has a tongue, has an interpretation. Let all things be done for edification.
- 27 If anyone speaks in a tongue, it should be by two or at the most three, and each in turn, and one must interpret;
- 28 but if there is no interpreter, he must keep silent in the church; and let him speak to himself and to God.

The Scriptures disclosed here are New Covenant Commandments from the LORD and must be obeyed by all who claim the name Jesus for themselves ... Christian. The true gift of tongues is a divinely received human language or languages and the gift of translation or interpretation of tongues is the divinely received ability to translate one or more of these God gifted languages. We will close this section with the last four verses of chapter 14.

- 1 Corinthians 14:37-40
- 37 If anyone thinks he is a prophet or spiritual, let him recognize that the things which I write to you are the **Lord's commandment**.
- 38 But if anyone does not recognize this, he is not recognized.
- 39 Therefore, my brethren, desire earnestly to prophesy, and do not forbid to speak in tongues.
- 40 But all things must be done properly and in an orderly manner.

The true gift of tongues is not something to be forbidden by the church but one that must be put in order as per the LORD's command. All things are for the edification of the church and all things must be done properly and in an orderly manner. Verse 40 will be our segue into an essential discussion of the pseudoglossa movement and why true Christians are to disassociate themselves from all people engaged in this ungodly practice.

PSEUDOGLOSSA FIASCO: COUNTERFEIT DOCTRINE OF DEMONS

Just as the true gift of tongues during the early first century church disintegrated into chaos that required Paul to spend about as much of his writing of Scripture in fixing the tongues fiasco as he did upon teaching Resurrection. We covered what tongues are so that alone should expose the pseudoglossa movement for what it is ... counterfeit! Scripture constantly warns New Covenant believers to beware of false doctrine, and false teachers.

2 Peter 2:1

But **false prophets <pseudoprophetes>** also arose among the people, just as there will also be **false teachers <pseudodidaskalos>** among you, who will secretly introduce destructive heresies, even denying the Master who bought them, bringing swift destruction upon themselves.

These warnings need to be heeded for those who introduce teaching not anchored in Scripture will shipwreck the faith of many and bring swift destruction upon themselves. There are many false teachers are in the Pentecostal/Charismatic movement that will ridicule those who base their beliefs upon sound understanding of Scripture; and scoff at the mention of doctrine as something evil and contrary to God. Grace and soundness of Spirit and Word is the largest threat to false teachers for the Word of God exposes their wickedness.

Titus 1:9

holding fast the faithful word which is in accordance with the teaching, so that he will be able both to exhort in sound doctrine and to refute those who contradict.

Such is the state today of many of these pseudochristian teachers. A serious danger with the false gifts is destructive. Pseudoglossa has brought into its fold demonism based to a large degree on tongues. Many Satanist and voo-doo religions have the gibberish of unrelated syllabic tongues and what exists in the pseudo-tongues movement is the same satanic language of these satanic groups. Even prayers sound more like incantations then they do heartfelt communion with the living God.

1 Timothy 4:1

¶ But the Spirit explicitly says that in later times some will fall away from the faith, paying attention to deceitful spirits and doctrines of demons,

Unless your are gifted with the Scriptural gift of tongues which is verifiable, be on guard against these false and deceptive teachers and movements and preserve the faith delivered to you by the Apostles and Scripture.

Mark 16:17

"These signs will accompany those who have believed: in My name they will cast out demons, they will speak with **new tongues <1100 glossa>**;

Luke 1:64

And at once his mouth was opened and his **tongue <1100 glossa>** *loosed*, and he *began* to speak in praise of God.

Luke 16:24

"And he cried out and said, 'Father Abraham, have mercy on me, and send Lazarus so that he may dip the tip of his finger in water and cool off my tongue <1100 glossa>, for I am in agony in this flame.'

Acts 2:3-4

- 3 And there appeared to them **tongues <1100 glossa>** as of fire distributing themselves, and they rested on each one of them.
- 4 And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak with other **tongues** <1100 glossa >, as the Spirit was giving them utterance.

Acts 2:11

- Revelation 4:1 After these things I looked, and behold, a door *standing* open in heaven, and the first **voice <5456 phone>** which I had heard, like *the sound* of a trumpet speaking with me, said, "Come up here, and I will show you what must take place after these things."
- Revelation 4:5 Out from the throne come flashes of lightning and **sounds <5456 phone>** and peals of thunder. And *there were* seven lamps of fire burning before the throne, which are the seven Spirits of God;
- Revelation 5:2 And I saw a strong angel proclaiming with a loud **voice <5456 phone>**, "Who is worthy to open the book and to break its seals?"
- Revelation 5:11 Then I looked, and I heard the voice <5456 phone> of many angels around the throne and the living creatures and the elders; and the number of them was myriads of myriads, and thousands of thousands,
- Revelation 5:12 saying with a loud **voice** <5456 phone>, "Worthy is the Lamb that was slain to receive power and riches and wisdom and might and honor and glory and blessing."
- Revelation 6:1 Then I saw when the Lamb broke one of the seven seals, and I heard one of the four living creatures saying as with a **voice <5456 phone>** of thunder, "Come."
- Revelation 6:6 And I heard *something* like a **voice <5456 phone>** in the center of the four living creatures saying, "A quart of wheat for a denarius, and three quarts of barley for a denarius; and do not damage the oil and the wine."
- Revelation 6:7 When the Lamb broke the fourth seal, I heard the **voice <5456 phone>** of the fourth living creature saying, "Come."

- Revelation 7:2 And I saw another angel ascending from the rising of the sun, having the seal of the living God; and he cried out with a loud **voice <5456 phone>** to the four angels to whom it was granted to harm the earth and the sea,
- Revelation 7:10 and they cry out with a loud **voice <5456 phone>**, saying, "Salvation to our God who sits on the throne, and to the Lamb."
- Revelation 8:5 Then the angel took the censer and filled it with the fire of the altar, and threw it to the earth; and there followed peals of thunder and **sounds <5456 phone>** and flashes of lightning and an earthquake.
- Revelation 8:13 Then I looked, and I heard an eagle flying in midheaven, saying with a loud **voice <5456 phone>**, "Woe, woe, woe to those who dwell on the earth, because of the remaining **blasts <5456 phone>** of the trumpet of the three angels who are about to sound!"
- Revelation 9:9 They had breastplates like breastplates of iron; and the **sound <5456 phone>** of their wings was like the **sound <5456 phone>** of chariots, of many horses rushing to battle.
- Revelation 9:13 Then the sixth angel sounded, and I heard a **voice <5456 phone>** from the four horns of the golden altar which is before God,

- Revelation 14:13 And I heard a **voice <5456 phone>** from heaven, saying, "Write, 'Blessed are the dead who die in the Lord from now on!'" "Yes," says the Spirit, "so that they may rest from their labors, for their deeds follow with them."
- Revelation 14:15 And another angel came out of the temple, crying out with a loud **voice <5456 phone>** to Him who sat on the cloud, "Put in your sickle and reap, for the hour to reap has come, because the harvest of the earth is ripe."
- Revelation 14:18 Then another angel, the one who has power over fire, came out from the altar; and he called with a loud **voice** <5456 phone> to him who had the sharp sickle, saying, "Put in your sharp sickle and gather the clusters from the vine of the earth, because her grapes are ripe."
- Revelation 16:1 Then I heard a loud **voice <5456 phone>** from the temple, saying to the seven angels, "Go and pour out on the earth the seven bowls of the wrath of God."
- Revelation 16:17 Then the seventh *angel* poured out his bowl upon the air, and a loud **voice <5456 phone>** came out of the temple from the throne, saying, "It is done."
- Revelation 16:18 And there were flashes of lightning and **sounds <5456 phone>** and peals of thunder; and there was a great earthquake, such as there had not been since man came to be upon the earth, so great an earthquake *was it, and* so mighty.
